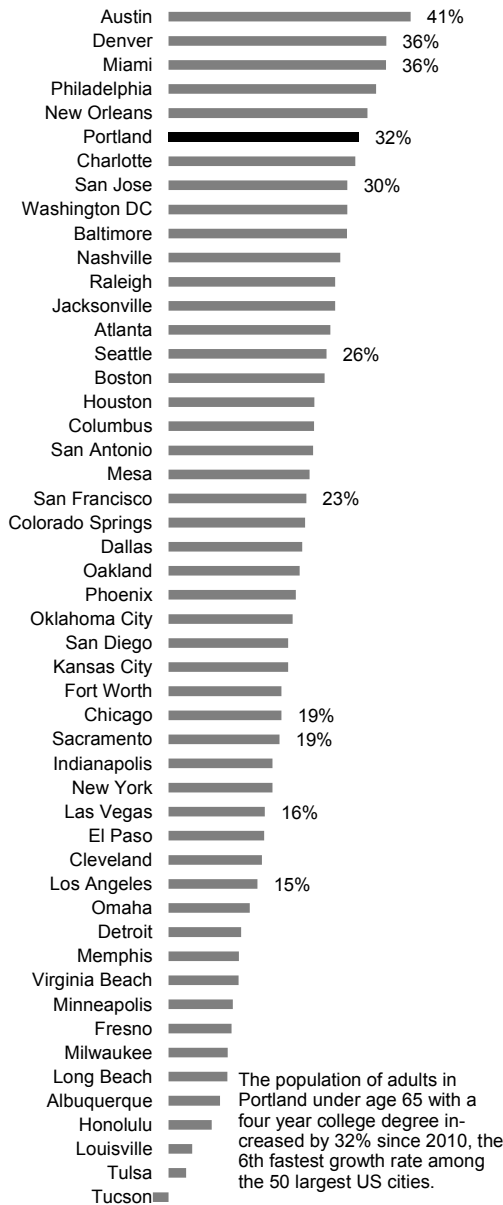


**College Graduate Growth**

50 Largest US Cities : 2010 to 2016 : Age 25 to 64

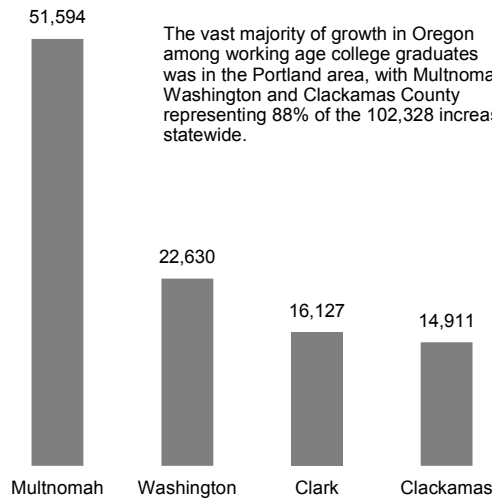


The population of adults in Portland under age 65 with a four year college degree increased by 32% since 2010, the 6th fastest growth rate among the 50 largest US cities.

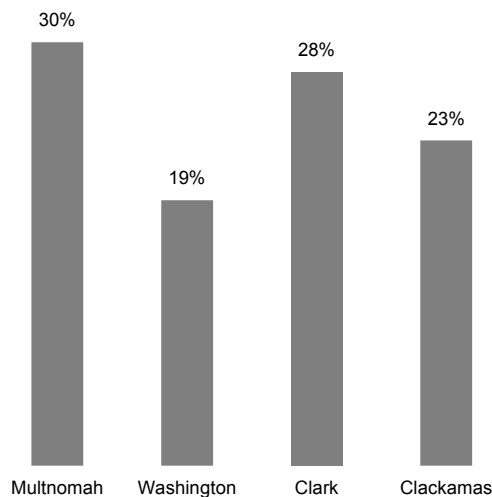
Portland Area Counties: 2010 to 2016 : Age 25 to 64



The vast majority of growth in Oregon among working age college graduates was in the Portland area, with Multnomah, Washington and Clackamas County representing 88% of the 102,328 increase statewide.

Portland Area Counties: 2010 to 2016 : Age 25 to 64

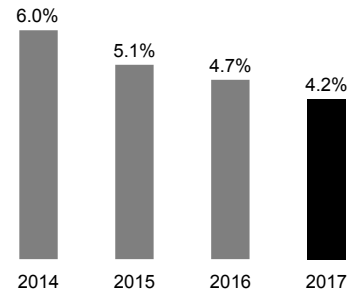


While Multnomah county dominates the net growth of working age college graduates in the region, on a percentage basis the growth is less uneven.

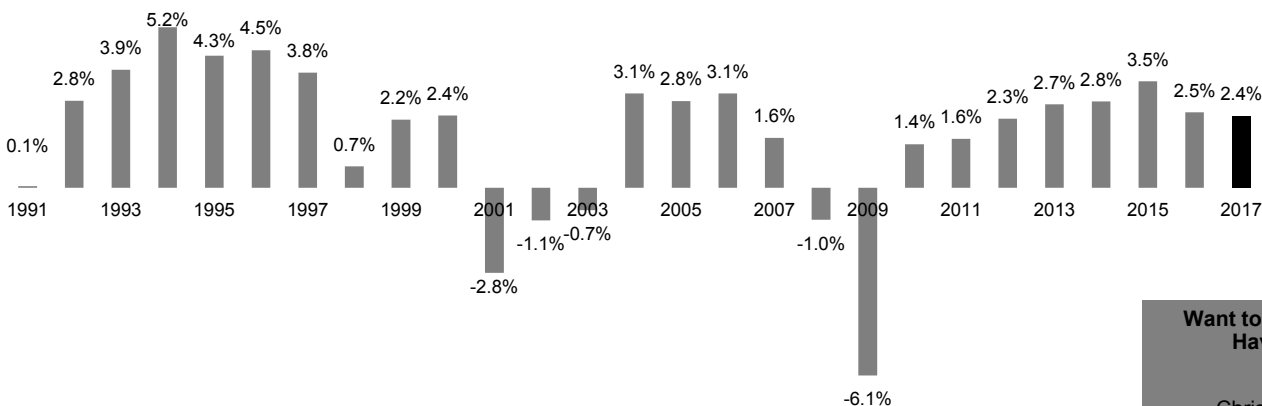
